Latest Hotel Bars in NYC You Should Visit Yesterday!

From South Brooklyn to Central Park and Roosevelt Island, there's been a hotel boom in NYC since last year. Here's a handful of great new spots that you should see and taste for yourself



The Lobby Bar at Hotel Chelsea

The <u>Lobby Bar</u> has opened its doors at the ground level of the legendary <u>Hotel Chelsea!</u> Not every day do you walk into a landmark so rich in cultural history, having housed some of the most famous artists, musicians and creative individuals of the last century. From Mark Twain and Stanley Kubrick to Madonna, lggy Pop, Robert Matherltop, Janis Joplin, and Leonard Cohen, to name a few.

After a few decades of push-and-pull renovations, Owners Sean MacPherson, Ira Drukier and Richard Born from The Bowery, The MarIton, The Ludlow, The Jane and The Maritime revived Hotel Chelsea, updating the interiors while preserving the hotel's original bohemian soul and some old-school European glamour. Operations are led by Sunday Hospitality and partner Charles Seich, with culinary direction by Chef Jaime Young, which opened its Spanish-inspired restaurant El Quijote earlier this year. Beverage Director Brian Evans, as well as classic libations inspired by iconic bars from around the world, including Dukes Martini from Dukes Hotel in London and the Singapore Sling created by Ngiam Tong Boon at Raffles Hotel in Singapore. The bar menu is modeled after a classic European-style lobby bar. It offers dishes such as Trout Roe Beignets, Charcuterie, Crudités, Caviar with potato chips and beer cream, Dirty Martini Oysters with gin and manzanilla olive ice, and Uni Toast with hazelnut toffee and black truffle.
